Dakota Valley Recycling (DVR) is a multi-city recycling program comprised of the cities of Lakeville, Apple Valley, Burnsville and Eagan.

DVR provides recycling, composting and waste disposal information and services to residents and businesses in its participating cities through a grant from Dakota County. The organization helps coordinate a number of annual events, including household hazardous waste drop-offs, shoe and

holiday light recycling, pumpkin composting, shred events and a number of educational workshops.

DVR's website is a great resource to find out where to recycle, what can go in the trash and what can't, how to dispose of specific types of items and more.

COUNCIL MEETING April 1, 2019

The City Council approved site improvement and stormwater management agreements for a new 18,000-square-foot Park Nicollet medical clinic building to be located at the northwest corner of the County Road 50/185th Street roundabout.

A contract was approved with S.M. Hentges & Sons for construction of the Dodd/Flagstaff roundabout. The cost will be shared with Dakota County.

A revised 2019-2020 hunting map was approved denoting where, with property owner permission, hunting is allowed in the City.

The Council approved the preliminary plat for the Spirit of Brandtjen Farm 21st Addition, which includes 99 detached townhome lots, 43 attached townhome lots, 12 common area lots and nine outlots.

County Road 50 and Holyoke Avenue Intersection Scheduled to Close Monday, April 8

Dakota County, in partnership with the City of Lakeville, is reconstructing County Road 50 (202nd Street) to a 2-lane divided roadway from Holyoke Avenue to Cedar Avenue. The project includes a roundabout at County Road 50 and Holyoke Avenue, a traffic signal at 202nd Street and Cedar Avenue, and more.

Weather permitting, the intersection of County Road 50 and Holyoke Avenue will close on Monday, April 8. Detour signs will be posted for County Road 50, downtown Lakeville, City Hall, Heritage Center, and Aronson and Quigley-Sime Parks.
